CSR ANNUAL REPORT – FY 2025-26



KEY FEATURES

- To achieve our mission statement 100% pass, Sansera Foundation, along with the financial support from JSSF, OBLF and management support of OBLF provided subject teachers in Mathematics, Science, Social Science, English, Hindi and Kannada conducted by 51 teachers across 31 Government schools comprising of 8,356 students from 1st std to 10th std. As a result, Anekal Taluk achieved first place our second mission students of 100% college / vocational training in the Class 10th examination for the academic year 2025-26
- **Co-Curricular Activities** - Yoga, Music, Computer Education, Physical Education conducted by 22 Resource Persons at 27 Govt. Schools of Anekal taluk and at the Permanent Computer Training Center at Sansera Gurubhavan, Anekal – 6727 Students benefited.
- **5S Activities** were implemented in 31 Govt. schools. and Training was provided to Sansera RPs, Subject Teachers, focusing on the implementation of the 5S methodology. – 4316 Students benefited..
- **Toilet Maintenance Program** Support to 52 Govt. Schools @ Anekal taluk and Bangalore South -1 & 3 – 12,562 Students benefited.

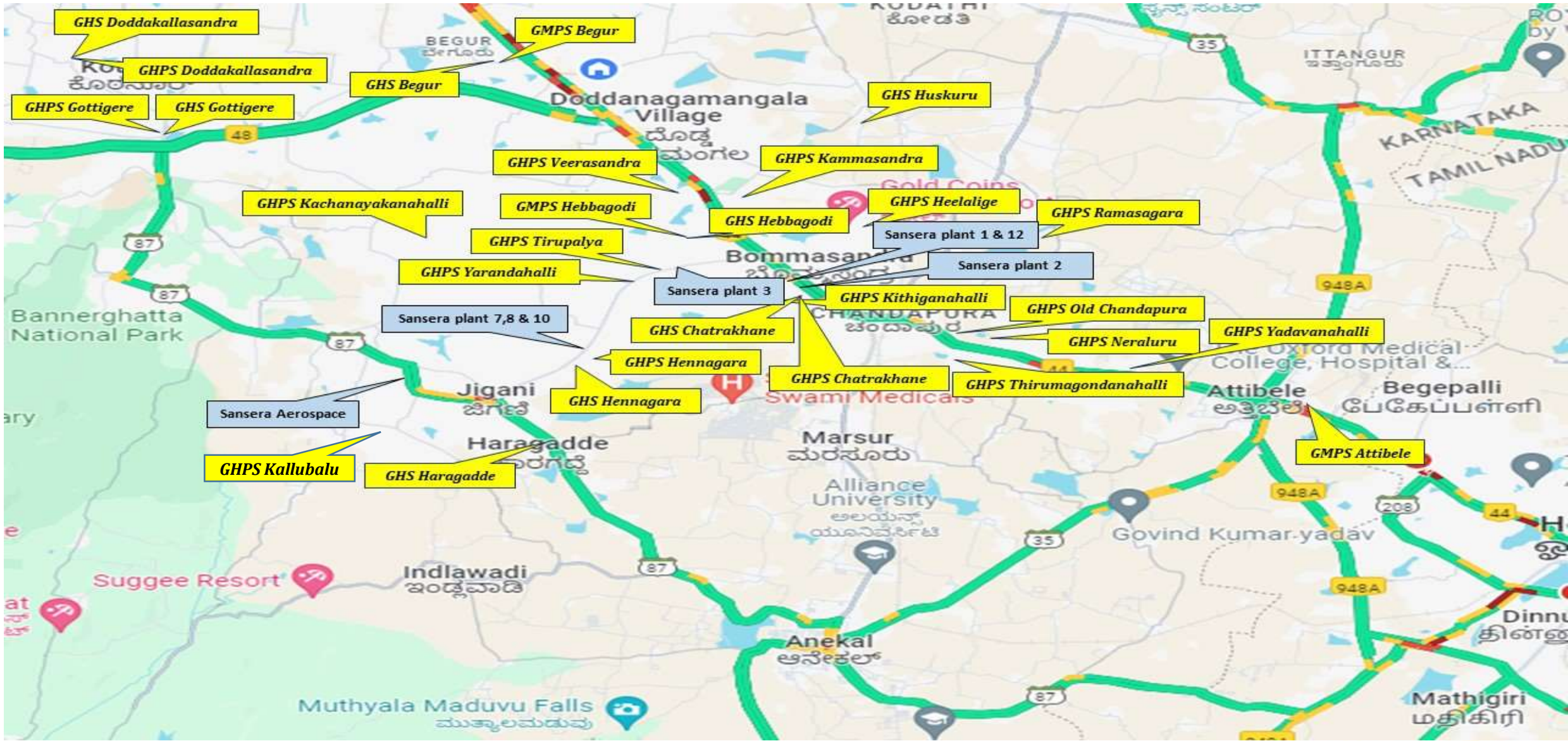

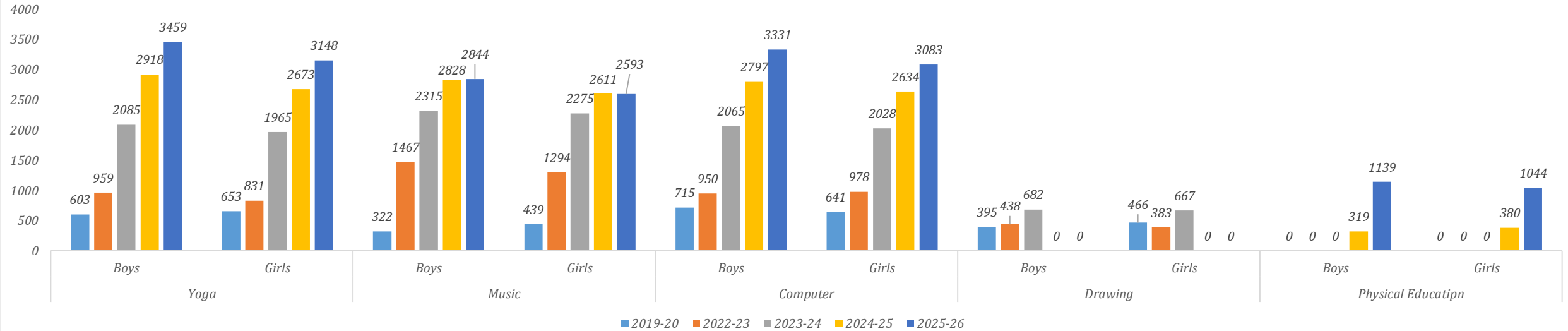

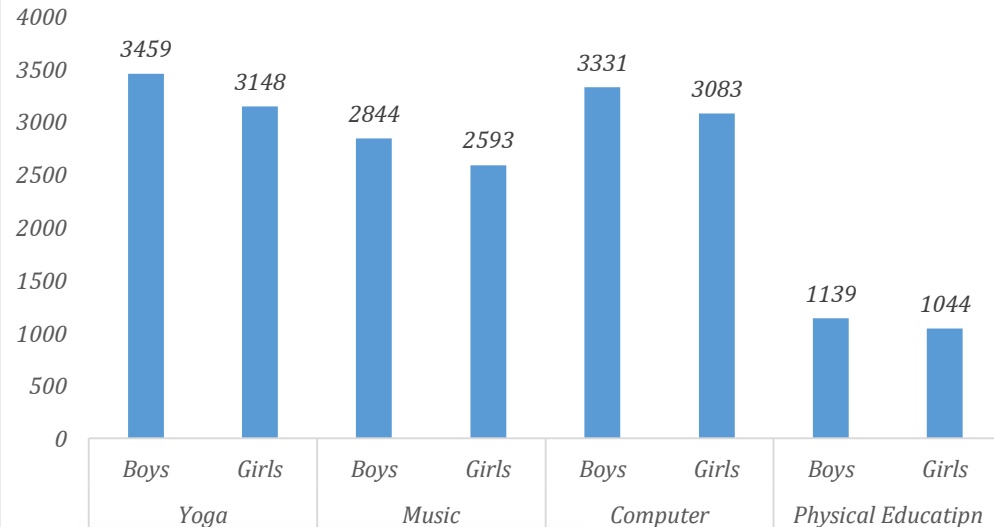


IMPACT OF CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (AY 2019-20 to AY 2025-26)

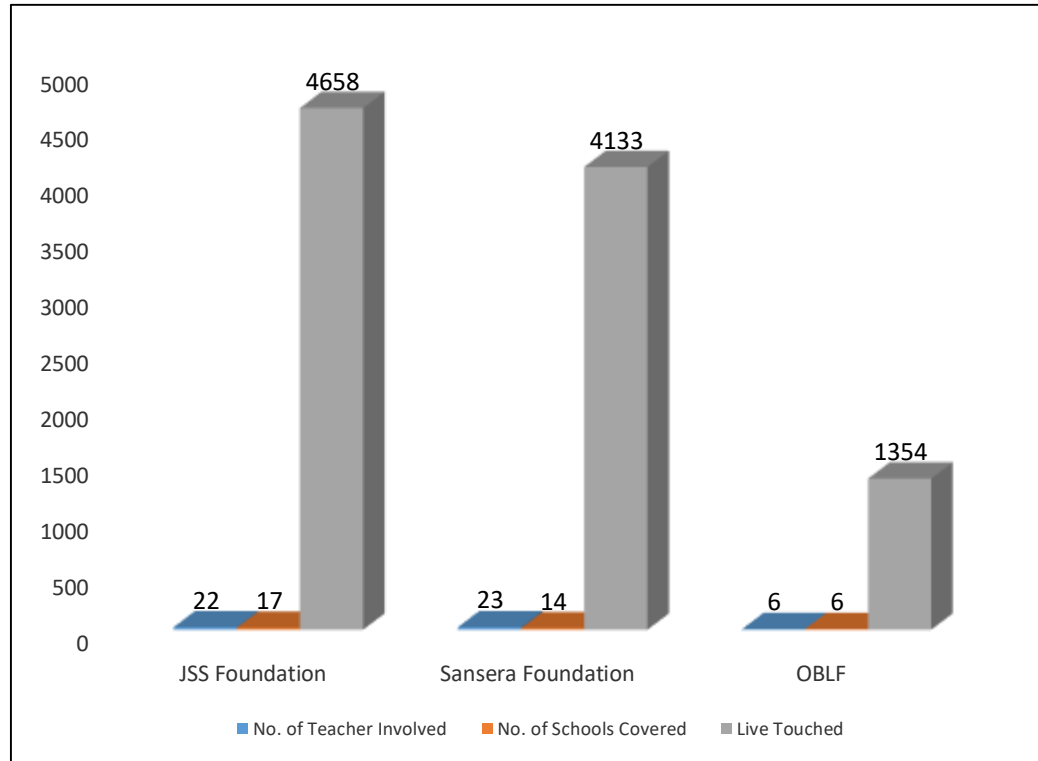

5S TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

TOILET MAINTENANCE PROGRAM

The Toilet Maintenance Program was implemented in 52 Government schools, benefiting 12,562 students. The initiative ensured clean, hygienic, and well-maintained sanitation facilities through regular maintenance and supply of cleaning materials. An amount of Rs. 10,12,000 was spent on remuneration expenses and Rs. 2,81,346 on cleaning materials.

The program improved hygiene standards, student health, regular toilet usage (especially among girl students), and awareness of sanitation practices. Overall, it contributed to a safe, dignified, and student-friendly school environment, supporting better attendance, concentration, and student well-being.

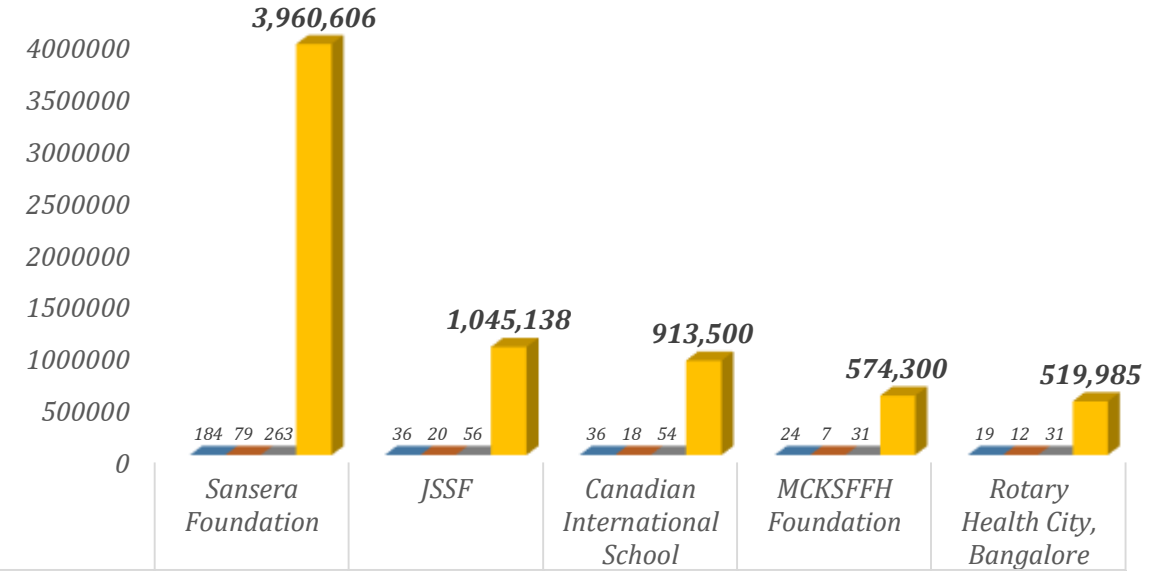

Organization-wise and Gender-wise Contribution (INR) in 2025-26

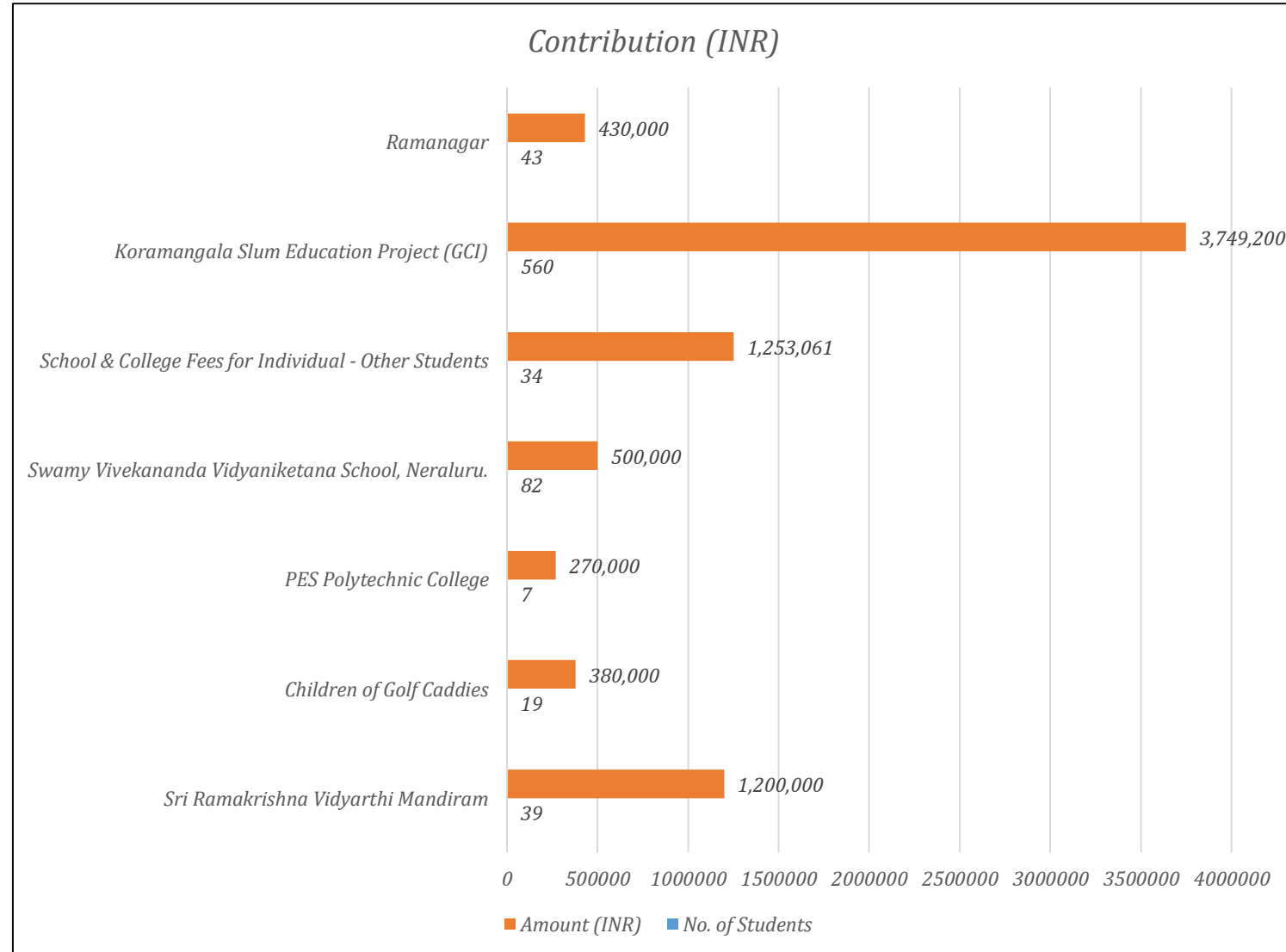

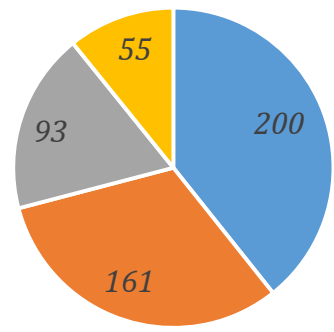

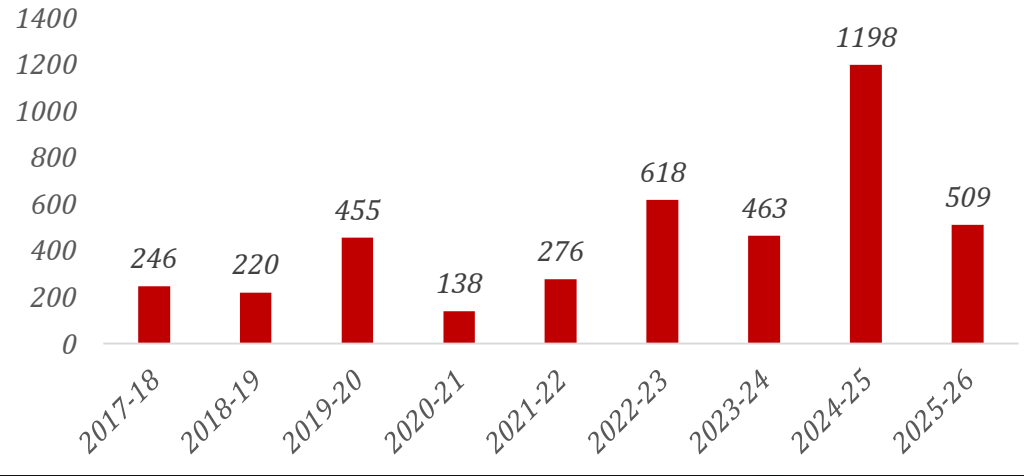
